- 4. Educator can assist the students by teaching the fundamental of reading, written language, mathematics and study organizational skills using innovative practices.

Objectives—

- 1. To support students who are performing poorly in comparison to their peers.
- 2. A teacher provides learning activities and practical experiences to students depending on their skills and requirements using the curriculum and teaching techniques used in the school.
- 3. To develop positive attitude and values, establishes the foundation for lifelong learning.

Outcome-

Remedial instruction begins by identifying the students' learning obstacles. Following the identification of these problems, the instructor must implement remedial instruction while keeping these problems in mind.




The challenges include—
